

# Parts of Speech

- A part of speech is a word based on its job in a sentence.
- This word can be a noun, pronoun, verb, adjective, adverb, preposition, conjunction, and interjection.



# Noun



- Definition: Names a person, place, thing, or an idea and belief. It can be a common or a proper noun.
  - Common noun
    - man, woman, human, car, giraffe, tiger, rose, tree, forest, building, house, kitchen, living room, bedroom, ruler, eraser, liquid paper, paper belief, thought, plan, understanding, thinking, concept, introduction, objective, method, hypothesis, result, discussion, conclusion, supplementary knowledge, religion,...

#### Proper noun

 Sunday, Monday, January, Samantha, the Great Pyramid of Giza, the Taj Mahal, Father's Day, Mother's Day, New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day, Father's Day, Songkran Festival, Labor Day, Visakha Bucha Day

# Verb



#### **Definition: Shows action or being.**

- Action verb
  - Walk, talk, see, slide, swing, roar, read, run, sing, sleep, swim, taste, eat, listen, leave look, define, describe, apply, analyze, arrange, list, discuss, demonstrate, explain, calculate, collect, choose,...
- Being verb or state verb: Does not show action/ has the sense of continuing.
  - Be (is, am, are, was, were), has, have, like, love, hate, smell,...
