OBJECTIVES OF THE LESSON

What is History Taking?

- Asking questions of patients to obtain information and aid diagnosis.
- Gathering both objective and subjective data for the purpose of generating differential diagnoses, evaluating progress following a specific treatment/procedure and evaluating change in the patient's condition or the impact of a specific disease process.



Case Study:

Chief complaints of the patient

A 43-year-old women with complaints of fever associated with sore throat 3 days.







Patient History Taking Demonstration



Summary of the situation

A 43-year-old women complained of low-grade fever with a sore throat, stuffy nose, yellowish mucus, and occasional nasal discharges drip in post pharynx, claimed to experience pain the right cheekbone for 3 days, and took antipyretic medication to reduce the fever thus prompted to seek medical help.

The patient also confided to have caught colds with yellowish mucus discharges at an average of 2-3 times per year, air gasping, wheezing sounds were observed upon doctor's auscultation and was later diagnosed with asthma.

Chief complaint/s and present illnesses (PI) can be easily recalled using **OLD CARTS**.


OLD CARTS

Onset,
Location/radiation,
Duration

Character, **A**ggravating factors

Relieving factors, **T**iming **S**everity
