These verbals are called **PARTICIPLES**:

present progressive tense (-ing)

past participle (-d/ ed & the irregular forms of past participle) of a verb

used as an adjective

PARTICIPLES

EXAMPLES:

The crying baby reached for his mother.



PARTICIPLES

EXAMPLES:



The crying baby reached for his mother.

Frightened, the panicking boy jumped away from the spider.

-ed form

**computerized, determined, excited, misunderstood,
renowned, self-centered, talented, unknown**

-ing form

**annoying, exasperating, frightening, gratifying, misleading,
thrilling, time-consuming, worrying**

**Remember that some irregular forms, such as
misunderstood and unknown, do not end in -ed at all.
This is simply a cover term for this form.**

**Adjectives with -ed or -ing endings are known as
PARTICIPIAL ADJECTIVES, because they have the same
endings as verb participles**

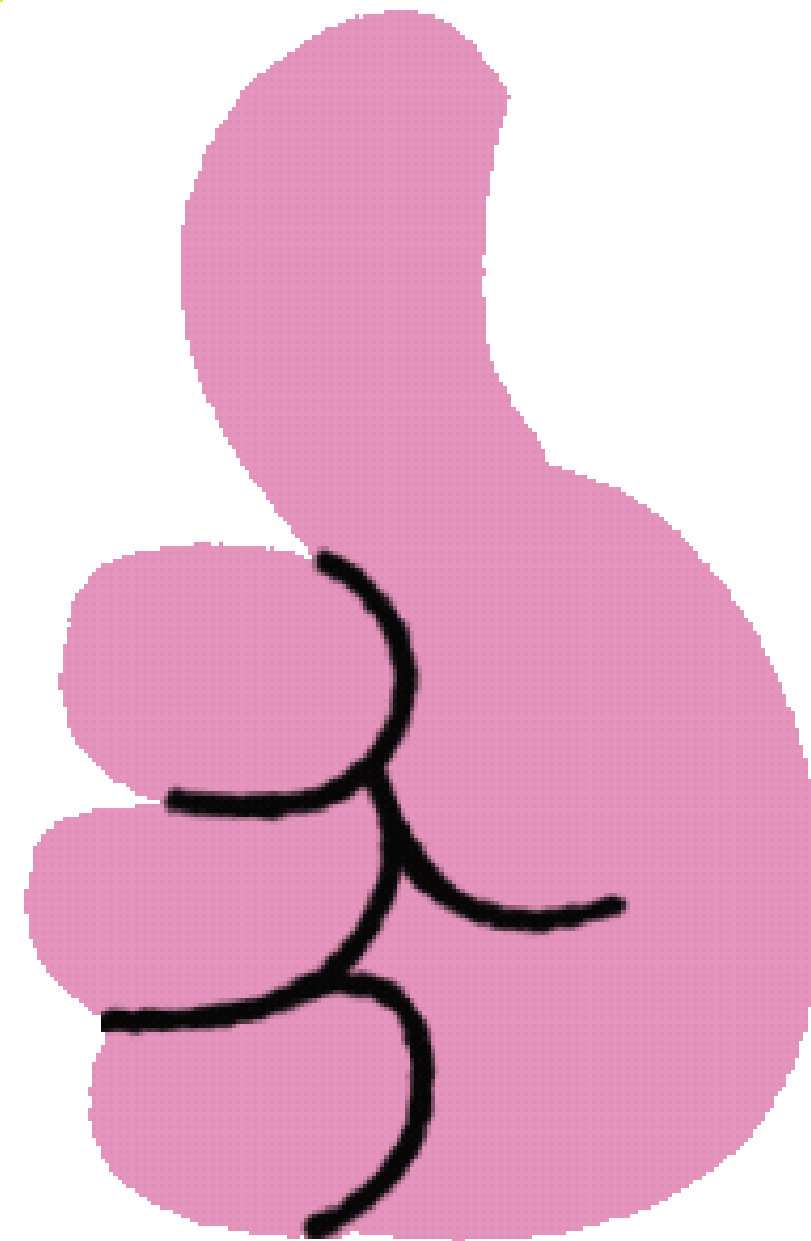
