Part 2 GI disorders

acute appendicitis



Appendicitis is thought to result from obstruction of the appendiceal lumen, typically by lymphoid hyperplasia but occasionally by a fecalith, foreign body, tumor, or even worms

Symptoms


- Epigastric or periumbilical pain
- nausea, vomiting, and anorexia
- · After a few hours, the pain shifts to the right lower quadrant

Signs

Right lower quadrant direct and rebound tenderness located at the McBurney point, Low-grade fever

Treatment

- appendectomy
- IV fluids and antibiotics




peritonitis



- Peritonitis is inflammation of the peritoneum.
- The tissues can become inflamed if they're exposed to irritating or infected body fluids.
- This usually happens when something inside leaks or breaks.

 Infection is the most common cause of peritonitis, and it can be very dangerous.




peritonitis



types of peritonitis

- Primary infection
 - Spontaneous bacterial peritonitis: ascites.
 - Primary infection: insert to peritoneal cavity by medical instruments
- Secondary infection: perforated, ruptured, Trauma, surgery

Sign&symptoms




Treatment

- > Antibiotics.
- > Surgery.
- > Other treatments.
 - Pain medications.
 - intravenous fluids.
 - Oxygen.
 - · blood transfusion.

intestinal diverticulum



Diverticula are small, bulging pouches that can form in the lining of your digestive system. They are found most often in the lower part of the large intestine.



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intestinal diverticulum




Symptoms

- Pain
- · Nausea and vomiting.
- Fever.
- · Abdominal tenderness.
- · Constipation or, less commonly, diarrhea

<u>Treatment</u>

- Antibiotics
- pain medications.
- Endoscopic procedures
- Surgery
- Lifestyle change



GI obstruction




A bowel obstruction is a partial or complete blockage of either of small intestine or large intestine.

Types of bowel obstruction

- Complete: A total blockage in the affected part of your intestine.
- Partial: A partial blockage or narrowing of the affected part.
- Pseudo: A "false" obstruction

causes

- Abdominal adhesions
- Hernias
- Cancerous tumors
- IBD
- Diverticulitis
- Intussusception
- Volvulus
- Radiation therapy
- · Ingesting a foreign object



GI obstruction



Symptoms

- Abdominal pain, cramping or bloating.
- Nausea and vomiting.
- · Lack of appetite.
- · feeling of illness
- · Diarrhea
- · dehydration.
- Severe constipation

Symptom	Small Bowel Obstruction	Large Bowel Obstruction
Pain	Intermittent, colicky Improves with vomiting	Continuous
Vomiting	Frequent Large-volume Bilious	Intermittent Feculent
Tenderness to palpation	More focal	More diffuse
Distention	Less marked	Marked with obstipation


<u>Treatment</u>

- Intravenous (IV) fluids
- Nasogastric tube
- Medications: anti-emetics, pain relievers
- Bowel rest: NPO
- Surgery

hernia



- A hernia occurs when part of body insides bulges through an opening or weakness in the muscle or tissue that contains it.
- Most hernias involve one of your abdominal organs pushing through one of the walls of your abdominal cavity.



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hernia



risk factors

- heavy lifting
- · chronic cough
- Chronic constipation
- A history of abdominal or pelvic surgery.
- Pregnancy, especially repeat pregnancies.
- · Chronic obesity

Treatment

- · pushed inside
- Hernia repair surgery
- Laparoscopic surgery









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
