empathy

- ability to understand and share the feelings of another person.
- In nursing, empathy is crucial for responding appropriately to patients' emotions.



#### **Paraphrasing**

- restating what someone has said in your own words to confirm understanding.
- In nursing, this is a common active listening strategy nurses use to show they are truly listening.



#### Clarification

- \* asking questions or requesting more information to ensure accurate understanding.
- In nursing, nurses often clarify information to avoid errors in patient care.



### Non-verbal cues

- communication through body language, facial expressions, and tone of voice.
- In nursing, understanding non-verbal cues helps nurses interpret how patients truly feel.



#### **Feedback**

- a listener's response that confirms understanding or asks for more information.
- In nursing, giving feedback during conversations helps nurses build trust with patients.

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### Active Listening



- Active listening means fully focusing on what the other person is saying and showing that you understand.
- Active Listening helps nurses connect with patients from the heart with passion and promotes better care.
- Active Listening is the process of fully concentrating on what is being said rather than just passively 'hearing' the message."



# Why is active listening in nursing important?



Reduces mistakes and improves patient care

Building trust between nurses and patients

Helps nurses understand patient needs better



#### How to practice active listening?

- Give your focus to the speaker with free from any distractions.
- Use body language such as nodding and making eye contact.
- Repeat what the patient says to show understanding.
- Ask questions to clarify

Simulates Real-Life Scenarios

- News stories often involve real events, crises, or health situations.
- ☐ Listening to and analyzing these helps nursing students practice focusing on essential details, just like when receiving patient information.





- Improves Focus and Comprehension
- Nurses must listen carefully for symptoms, emotions, and instructions.
- News-based exercises require focused listening to extract key points, enhancing attention and comprehension skills.





- Enhances Empathy and Critical Thinking
- Many news stories involve people's struggles, emotions, or public health concerns.
- This helps students connect emotionally and think critically, skills essential for empathetic nursing care





- Builds Vocabulary and Medical Awareness
- □ Health-related news introduces relevant terms and current issues, helping students expand their medical vocabulary and stay informed, crucial for understanding patients and colleagues.





Encourages Reflective Listening Practice

☐ Through summaries, paraphrasing, and discussion of news clips, students practice reflecting on what they've heard, key elements of active listening used in patient-nurse interactions.
