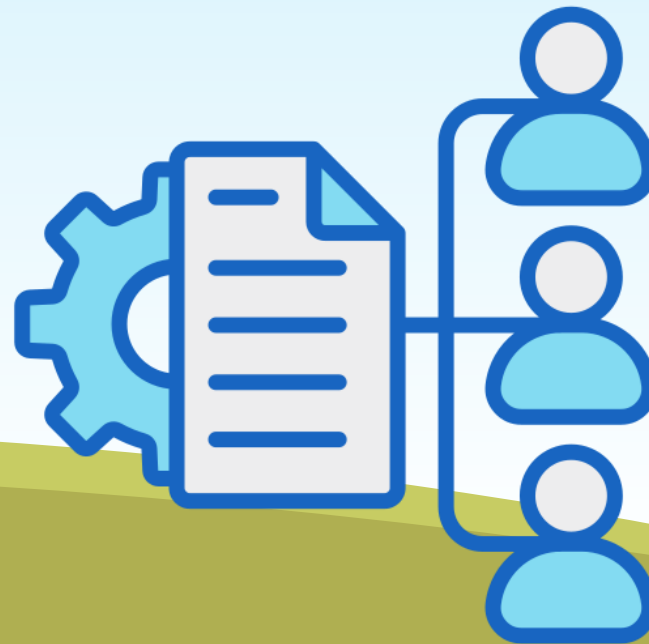
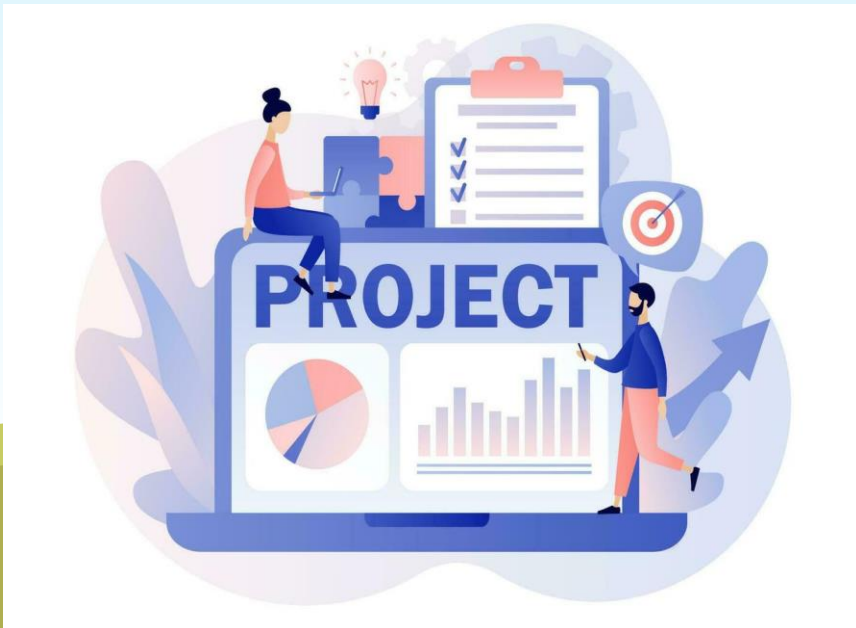
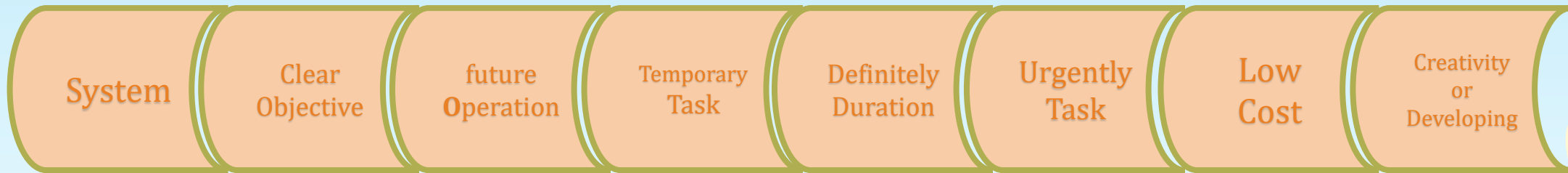


Meaning

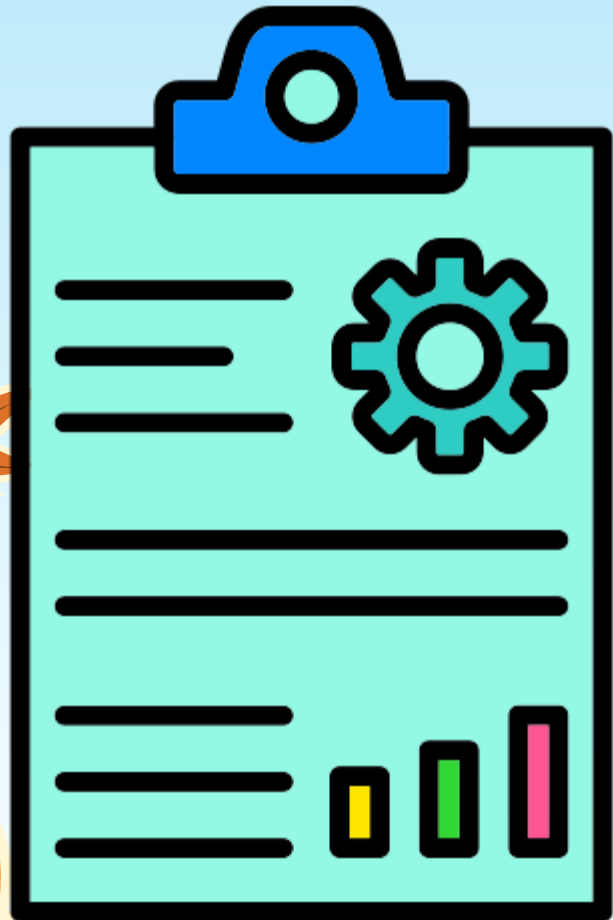
